## New Deadline for Advancement on Salary Schedule Begins Fall 2009

The contract language ratified this past February included a change to the date for advancement on the salary schedule. The deadline to file a request for a change in your salary schedule classification with the Personnel Office is Thursday, **October 1.** Coursework must be completed by October 1 in order to qualify for advancement. The next opportunity for advancement on the salary schedule will be **January 31.** 

## **California Propositions A-E Fail**

Anticipated revenues from the State appear to be lost based on the May 19 Special Election. The Governor recommends cuts in 2008-2009 and 2009-2010 funding based on the defeat of Propositions A-E.
