Educational reforms enacted by the California Legislature and signed into law by the Governor will affect all California schools whether or not the state receives RTTT funds. Such reforms like the Open Enrollment and Parent Trigger will create disorder in school districts and take resources away from the classroom. If that is not enough there's more. Our Governor's proposed state budget includes changes to our seniority rights and March layoff notification process.
