Tell Me More About Adjunct Duties

Adjunct duties is a term identified specifically with Stull Bill evaluation requirements. During your Stull Bill year, you are contracted to complete two non-instructional duties which would normally be performed before or after the Board Day. You pick your adjunct duties from a list provided by the site principal. The list would typically include

Committee Work Dance/Athletic Events Leadership Camp Building Rep for the Montebello Teachers Association PTA Activities Special Site Events Office Bulletin Boards

Adjunct duties are not required during non-Stull years.

Who Gets Stulled?

- TC and Probationary Bargain Unit members are Stulled every year.
- Permanent Bargaining Unit members are Stulled every other year.
- Permanent Bargaining Unit members who have completed 10 consecutive years experience in this District and have not been referred to PAR in the past two years are Stulled every 5 years.

Classroom Teachers May Suspend Students from Class

Education Code 48910 states that a teacher may suspend any pupil from the teacher's class, for any of the acts enumerated in Section 48900, for the day of the suspension and the day following. The teacher shall immediately report the suspension to the principal of the school and send the pupil to the principal or the principal's designee for appropriate action. If that action requires the continued presence of the pupil at the school site, the pupil shall be under appropriate supervision, as defined in policies and related regulations adopted by the governing board of the school district. As soon as possible, the teacher shall ask the parent or guardian of the pupil to attend a parentteacher conference regarding the suspension. Whenever practicable, a school counselor or a school psychologist shall attend the conference. A school administrator shall attend the conference if the teacher or the parent or guardian so requests.

The pupil shall not be returned to the class from which he or she was suspended, during the period of the suspension, without the concurrence of the teacher of the class and the principal.

A pupil suspended from a class shall not be placed in another regular class during the period of suspension. However, if the pupil is assigned to more than one class per day this subdivision shall apply only to other regular classes scheduled at the same time as the class from which the pupil was suspended.

A teacher may also refer a pupil, for any of the acts enumerated in Section 48900, to the principal or the principal's designee for consideration of a suspension from the school.
