MTA Places Last, Best, Final on the Table

The Association has declared IMPASSE, meaning that the Association and District teams are dead-locked on the issue of a one-time vs. ongoing raise in 2015-2016. The impasse declaration was made at the table Wednesday, March 2 and sent to the Public Employee Relations Board (PERB) Thursday, March 3. PERB is expected to send a mediator to help the two sides come to agreement.

Yes! The BOE Can Certainly Improve It's Offer!

Representatives of the Association know that the BOE can afford an ongoing raise. The District received \$30 million ongoing in 2015-2016. This is nearly a 13 percent increase in one year. The BOE has awarded raises to the two highest paid employees (Superintendent Susanna Contreras Smith and Chief Financial and Operations Officers Cleve Pell). The BOE has the means for an on-going raise. The Governor's proposed budget will guarantee the District another \$15 million ongoing money for 2016-2017. This will likely be another 6 percent increase in revenues next year.

Paying Teachers Is the Law


The majority of State funding is required to go to paying teachers. To clarify this directive California has made it a law that a minimum of 55 percent of expenditures be on the classroom. This calculation includes teachers salaries, instructional aide salaries, STRS, PERS, and all other driven costs to pay those employed to work in the classroom.


District's Commitment Dwindles

As you can see in the chart below, the District's committed dollars is a smaller percentage each year. Using the information supplied by the District to the California Department of Education, the District is spending a lesser percentage on the classroom each year.

If the BOE continues to resist lowering class size and improving wages, the percentage will continue to decline.
