Monitor Class Size from the First Day of School

The District must adhere to class size agreements beginning **Monday, September 13**. In the meantime, please notify the MTA Office of excessive overages in class size. The Association will continue to monitor and advocate for stable classes. Accurate class size information aids the District in balancing classes and programming students in and out of contract independent study (CIS).

The District often opens combination classes when additional settings are approved. The MOU states that the District shall make every effort to prevent combination classes. Where combination multi-grade classes are unavoidable, a \$500 stipend per each semester to general education combination class in TK through grade 5 with more than one grade level of students, and special education class with more than two grade levels.

General Education and Special Education class size maximums will be honored with no more than three students additional. A \$400 will be paid to those with one to three additional students.

COVID-19 Tests Are Available Through Health Care Providers



The District does not have COVID-19 testing available for members and students at this time. A vendor contract is expected to be presented to the Board of Education Wednesday, September 1.

According to COVID19.LACounty.gov/testing-faq health care providers are required by the LA County Health Officer Order to provide their patients with access to COVID testing if they have

symptoms, are part of a public health investigation, or have been in close contact with someone with COVID-19. Getting a test through your regular health care provider will help you get the care you need. If your health care provider is unable to give you a test, you can make an appointment for a COVID-19 test at a community test site.

The Catastrophic Leave Bank (CLB) allows certificated employees (MTA & AMSA) to donate sick days to colleagues with catastrophic illnesses. The form is available at montbelloteachers.org/forms/clbform.pdf.

- You may automatically donate 1 day per year by checking the appropriate box on the form.
You are eligible to participate in the CLB during any year in which you donated at least 1 day.
- Withdrawals are made in 20 day intervals with a maximum of 60 days.
- All those eligible for the days receive the days.
- The deadline to donate days is **November 15**.
