Tell Me More About My Adjunct Duties

Adjunct duties is a term identified specifically with Stull bill valuation requirements. During your Stull Bill year, you are contracted to complete two non-instructional duties which would normally be performed before or after the Board Day. You pick your adjunct duties from a list provided by the site principal. The list would typically include:

- Committee Work
- Dance/Athletic Events
- Leadership Camp
- Building Rep for MTA
- PTA Activities
- Special Site Events
- Office Bulletin Boards

Adjunct duties are not required during your non-Stull years.

What Are the Evaluation Cycles?

- Probationary Bargaining Unit members are evaluated every year.
- HeadStart teachers are evaluated every year.
- Permanent Bargaining Unit members are evaluated every other year.
- Permanent Bargaining Unit members who meet the following criteria are evaluated **every five years**:
 - ◆ NCLB Highly Qualified
 - ◆ Ten consecutive years Bargaining Unit experience within the District at the time of the completion of the Stull Evaluation; and,
 - ◆ Not referred to the PAR Program within the past two years.

The District and the Association have agreed to a joint committee on Evaluation Procedures. More information will be available after the first meeting.

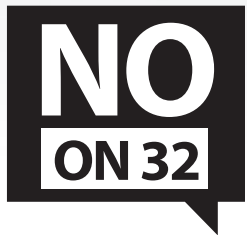
Stop the Special Exemptions Act

IT'S NOT WHAT IT SEEMS

Prop 32 was intentionally written to create special exemptions for billionaire businessmen, giving them even more political power to write their own set of rules.

The facts:

- **Prop 32 exempts secretive Super PACS, which can raise unlimited amounts of money from corporate special interests and billionaire businessmen to support their candidates or defeat their enemies.** And 32 does nothing to stop anonymous donors from influencing elections.
- **Prop 32 doesn't solve Sacramento's problems, because it was intentionally written to restrict only some companies, while providing huge exemptions to others,** like Wall Street investment firms, hedge funds, real estate developers, insurance companies and corporations that can still create front groups and make unlimited campaign expenditures supporting candidates.
- **Prop 32 unfairly singles out our teachers, nurses and firefighters and limits their voices on issues that matter to us all** – like cuts to our schools and colleges, police and fire response times, workplace safety, consumer protections, homeowner rights and unfair corporate tax giveaways.
