


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High School Students Can Request Letter Grades



The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) regarding the coronavirus was amended May 5. Two changes were made.

1. 9-12 grade students may request letter grades for second semester 2020.
2. The instructional supply reimbursement was clarified.

Financial Aid Applications & College Admissions Prompt Change in Grading Policy

Any 9-12 grade student may request a letter grade in writing (e.g., email) to the teacher no later than Friday, May 22 in lieu of pass/no pass. The letter grade will be no less than the grade posted on the third quarter report card. The District will inform high school students and families of this policy including the due date.

Submit Instructional Supply Reimbursements Electronically

Bargaining Unit members may begin utilizing the 2020-2021 \$200 instructional supply reimbursement in the 2019-2020 school year. (Article XII.3 Wages p. 20)

- Bargaining Unit members will complete the District Reimbursement Form for consumable instructional supplies purchased.*
- Bargaining Unit members will complete the District Reimbursement Form including the Asset Tracking Section for equipment purchased. Any equipment reimbursed by the District is property of the District, and joint ownership does not apply.*
- The total reimbursement for supplies and/or equipment will not exceed the \$200.*
- The District Reimbursement Form must be sent (e.g., U.S.P.S. or electronically) including all receipts to Finance at the District office for payment and proper asset tracking. The reimbursement form is available on the District website on the Finance page. Reimbursement forms may be turned in until January 31, 2021. The reimbursement will be processed in a timely manner.*

Summer School Discussion Continue Next Week

Nearly 600 summer school surveys were submitted. The responses were reviewed prior to today's discussions. Bargaining Chairperson David Navar (WGE) and Executive Director Kathy Schlotz met with the District concerning summer school plans. Assistant Superintendent Kaivan Yuen reviewed the initial plans to offer distance learning summer school at all levels. The District and the Association agreed to meet again Tuesday, May 12 to discuss working conditions for the summer.
